LEE MAKES THE NEWSPAPER

You may have all noticed the feature story about Lee Bakewell, his purple martins, and the “international” attention they have been receiving as described in the Pioneer Press article of the 7/28/11 (front page of the 2nd section). But what you may have missed was that the same day, the Forest Lake Times ran a similar article some of which is repeated below:

. . . Bakewell – who added a second martin house for this summer and plans a third for next – has his hands full. About 75 chicks were hatched in his houses this summer, so in addition to keeping meticulous notes he must look out for the welfare of nearly 100 birds. This means regular cleaning of each “room” in the

houses and the occasional flicking of crickets and scrambled eggs [if the weather turns cold so they cannot find flying insects to eat].

Then there are the efforts to band the birds in order to track their location. Thanks to the small anklets, Bakewell knows that two of his adult residents were hatched at his place last summer.

In addition to a regular banding session, Bakewell hosted an expert from a national purple martin group earlier this month who fitted seven birds with “geo locators.” The small devices will store data on sunrise and sunset times, effectively recording the route of migration to and from South America.

“Once installed, we have to bide our time like an expectant father for some nine months until the martins return...if they return,” Bakewell said. “Then the bird is trapped, the device removed, and sent in for analysis.”

The population spike at Bakewell’s colony is good news for prospective martin landlords in the area. As only 20 percent or less of the [newly hatched] birds will return to the same location from year to year, that means about 75 birds will be looking for a new place to call home in the area come next spring.

Bakewell’s colony includes one martin that was banded in Hugo and one from Lindstrom. He also knows of another colony on Forest Lake with 16 adult pairs this year, so the opportunity is there for those curious about hosting martins.
